Make Your Voice Heard: Register and Vote

2020 is an important election year. The elections will include people running for local, state and federal offices. The people we elect will be voting on health, education, infrastructure, housing and other issues that can affect our independence and well-being. Your vote is a powerful tool.

Legislators pay attention to how many voters care about issues they consider. In fact, when CIDNY goes to Albany, our ability to tell legislators that people with disabilities vote and to tell them the stories about how their actions affect us makes a huge difference in whether they support our issues. We will also be electing a president this year, a president who may influence legislation that affects our community.

New York City will hold the first of four elections in April. If you are not registered to vote or don't know if you are, CIDNY can help. You can pick up a registration form at CIDNY. If you need help filling it out or if you have other questions, our counselors will help you. Once you fill out the form and sign it, we can deliver your registration form to the NYC Board of Elections for you.

If you prefer, you can take the form to your local Board of Elections office yourself or you can mail it in. You can also register to vote online by going to: https://www.vote.nyc.ny.us/html/voters/register.shtml.

You can find out if your registration is active at https://www.vote.nyc.ny.us/html/voters/voters.shtml. You can also check to make sure you know your polling site; some sites may have been changed. If you do not have access to the internet but want to check your registration, register to vote online or check your polling site, a CIDNY counselor can help.

Here are the dates for the 2020 elections:

 Tuesday, April 28 - Presidential Primary for both republican and democratic parties (you must be registered in a party to vote in the primary);

On-Demand Pilot Program

The On-Demand pilot program run by MTA was largely successful for the test group of 1,200 people with disabilities. The program allowed people to order a yellow or green accessible cab for same day service.

In November, Alex Elegudin, MTA's Senior Advisor for Accessibility, presented a new plan for the program. Although the plan adds an additional 1,200 users to the On-Demand program, it also limits rides to 16 a month and will only pay \$15 per ride. This means that riders would have to figure out when they think it is important to use On-Demand and whether \$15 is enough to get to their destination. But how do you budget for a ride when you don't know what it will cost and how do you anticipate unexpected trips to the doctor or to pick up a sick child from school?

The City Council and several State legislators support our assessment that this new plan is unacceptable. People who use subways and buses don't have limits on the number of rides or where they can travel. They don't have to make a decision about going to an important appointment based on whether it will cost more than a regular fare.

The MTA board will be discussing the proposed plan. Watch for an action alert this month based on what the MTA board decides to do. For more information on this and other paratransit issues, please contact Tashia Lerebours at tlerebours@cidny.org.

Make Sure You're Counted This Year

The United States Census will take place starting in January.

Why should I take part?

The government makes decisions about all kinds of things based on the U.S. Census count. How many congressional representatives each state gets, how much money each state gets for health benefits, schools, hospitals, emergency response planning and roads is decided by the number of residents each state has. This is especially important for communities like ours – people with disabilities – who have been undercounted for years.

What will the Census ask?

You will **not be asked** if you are a citizen of the U.S. or about any immigration status.

You will be asked about:

- the number of people living or staying at your home;
- whether you own or rent;
- a phone number for someone living in the home (only to be used for official Census business like clarifying an answer or filling in a skipped answer);
- the name, sex, age, date of birth and race of each person in the home;
- whether the person is of Hispanic, Latino or Spanish origin; and
- the relationship of each person to a central person in the home.

Image description: Did you know that you can enroll in Medicaid any time of the year? Medicaid programs cover 1 in 5 Americans. In all states, Medicaid provides coverage for some low-income people, families and children, pregnant women, the elderly, and people with disabilities. If you qualify, you can enroll immediately.
